He was the older brother of The Thoroughbred Corporation owner Ahmed Salman, and the son-in-law of Khalid Abdullah, the owner of Juddmonte Farms. Salman first came to the notice of American racegoers in 1992 when Cole shipped Zoman to Laurel to win the 1992 Washington D.C. International.

Other big winners trained for the Prince by Cole included Bint Pasha, Knight's Baroness, and Riyadian. More recently, Salman had 1999 European 3-year-old filly champion Ramruma with Henry Cecil Prince Ahmed bin Salman owned a horse.
